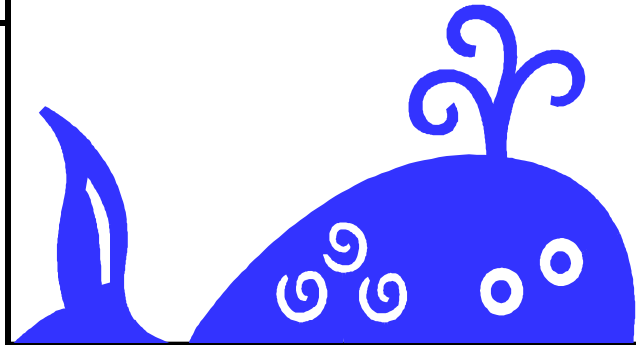
Science/Social Studies:

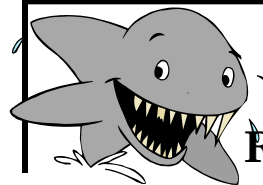

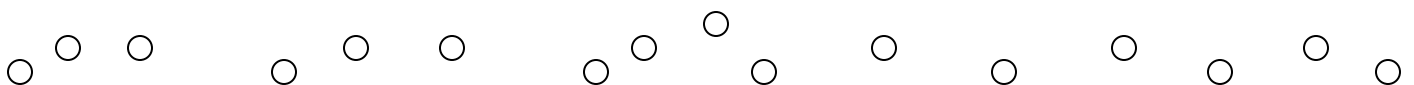

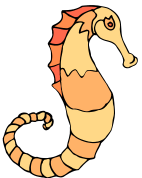
