

**WELCOME TO ENRICHMENT III**

Registration for Enrichment will begin on Wednesday, January 18th, at 8:00 AM, in the library. All classes must be paid in full during registration and parents may only register children if they are in good financial standing with the school. Cash or checks (made out to Sigsbee Charter School) are acceptable forms of payment.

To register, please read the descriptions carefully to find any restrictions on grade levels or prerequisites. There are limits to class size and registration will take place on a first-come, first-serve basis. **The attached form may be used in advance to expedite the process and keep the lines short. Please fill out a form for each child you are registering. Additional forms will be available during sign-ups. Sign-ups will also be available at the All-School Meeting on Thursday.**

Please remember to send a bag lunch with your child on Wednesday if he/she is participating in enrichment.

In addition, please be sure that the children understand they must be certain that they can maintain respectful and responsible behavior throughout the programs if they want to participate.

**What is Wednesday Enrichment?**

Wednesday afternoons are a special time at Sigsbee Charter School. Dismissal occurs at 12:00 every Wednesday. Children have the option of spending the afternoon with a parent or enrolling in some of our extraordinary enrichment classes. Our classes are offered for a nominal fee which allows us to pay our visiting instructors and provide materials for our classes. In addition, extra funds are used to purchase equipment and materials for the school.

During enrichment, the classroom teachers are engaged in professional development and team meetings. They study the craft of teaching, work together to create and refine our educational programs, and continue learning so that they can continue to be wonderful professionals.
